Quilt Show Update!

Thursday, Jan. 11, I got an email from Geneva Community Center. They were telling me that the Geneva School District has AP exams and will use their building for the dates of the quilt show! So, even though I asked specifically about this when booking the show, we got bumped. They will allow access to be Friday evening to set up after 6 pm, show Saturday and Sunday the 18 and 19.

I am not happy this occurred, but, it is difficult to find another venue. So, at present, I have asked to renegotiate our fee because of the changes since we have had publicity out since September in the new QCNYSPassports.

Update as of 3:30pm Tuesday January 16, 2018:

I just got off the phone with Geneva Community Center. This is where we stand:

Fri eve Set up from 6 to? Midnight deadline. We will need helpers to get the vendors in and set up ASAP first.

Then we will need help hopefully kids and guild members to set up quilts.

If we break the set-up down to a team on each aisle, I think we can get it set up fast. We were done last time with everything at about 4 pm, so I anticipate we could be out by 10- 10:30 pm.

May 19 Saturday, we have access from 8 am until 6 pm.

May 20 Sunday, we have access from 8 am until 6 pm.

I did strongly try to get the first dates as we had agreed to, the Manager was told no by her Director even though we are paying customers. I tried also to get a reduction in price, but our hours were the same.

I was successful in getting us the use of the "Black Box "which will be the site of our speaker's presentation. This normally runs for \$125 for the use of it.

I am now contacting our vendors to see if they can still come! And we need to change the rack cards and put out new flyers! Lots of work to take care of. Our speaker can come for the new dates. I also must change the hotel reservation.
